### **Only Rain in the Storm Drain**

In the city of Grayson, the stormwater drainage system is designed to collect excess water that occurs with rainfall and direct it to local waterways including creeks, streams, lakes and rivers. Since the water that enters a storm drain does not go to a treatment plant to be cleaned, we need to prevent any discharge of contaminants into our storm drains and, ultimately, our streams.

Here are a few reminders of what you can help protect water quality:

- Never dump anything down storm drains
- Check your vehicle for leaks and repair them quickly
- Clean up after your pets
- Avoid overspray of lawn care products onto sidewalks and driveways
