### **Adopt-a-Road in Grayson Today!**

Even a beautiful city like Grayson can still have litter along the roadsides. If left on the ground, this trash will be washed by the rain or blown by the wind into the stormwater drainage system where it can pollute our natural resources. Fortunately, there is something city residents can do to help - you can adopt a segment of roadway in Grayson.

Gwinnett Clean & Beautiful (GCB) and the Gwinnett Department of Transportation's Adopt-a-Road program makes it simple to plan a road-side cleanup. It's easy to register, and it can be a fun activity for your club, troop, or other community group. Your efforts will create a healthier and more beautiful environment, and as a bonus GCB will install a sign with your group's name along the road! We all share the same roads—so if you want to do your part for our community and keep Grayson's roadways free of litter, just follow these steps:

- Check for a road that needs some extra TLC

- Contact GCB to see if the section of road you would like to adopt is available
- Hold your first of four annual cleanup events—GCB provides free gloves, garbage bags, “Volunteers Working” signs, and safety vests
- Fill out a post-cleanup report on the GCB website to share your results

Grayson has 86 different roads within city limits covering around 25 total miles – so there are plenty of roads to adopt! Clean up your commute, help your community, and protect the environment by adopting a road today!
