

Keeping Grayson Clean and Green

Grayson cares about our community and the environment and needs your help to keep our waterways clean. Dumping anything other than rainwater into a storm drain is considered an illicit discharge, which is prohibited by the City's Illicit Discharge and Illegal Connection Ordinance. Illicit discharges harm our local waterways by causing pollution. This is because anything that enters a storm drain leads directly into natural waterways. Common discharges into storm drains include grass clippings, leaves, motor oil, chemicals, soapy water, and pet waste.

To prevent illicit discharges, remember these helpful tips:

- Compost grass clippings and leaves
- Recycle used motor oil at auto parts stores
- Wash your car on grass or gravel
- Clean up after your pets
