

Keeping Waterways Pollution Free

In Grayson, we care about our community and the environment, and we need your help to keep our waterways clean. Sometimes, people dump grass clippings, leaves, motor oil, pet waste, and soapy water into storm drains. However, only rainwater belongs in the storm drains - anything else is considered an "illicit discharge," and can pollute local waterways.

Additionally, illicit discharges violate Grayson's Illicit Discharge and Illegal Connection Ordinance.

To prevent illicit discharge, remember these helpful tips:

- Compost grass clippings and leaves
- Recycle used motor oil at auto parts stores
- Wash your car on grass or gravel
- Clean up after your pets
